



Call for Management Board Membership 2022-2024

The Canadian Centre on Statelessness (CCS) is seeking applications to fill four (4) vacancies on its Management Board. Each position is a non-remunerated two-year term, commencing in August 2022 and ending in July 2024. Elections will take place at our Annual General Meeting on **August 15, 2022 at 6:00pm EST**.

Qualifications

- A commitment to the CCS mission, vision, and guiding principles. For details, please visit our website at www.statelessness.ca;
- Experience with statelessness, immigration, or citizenship in any of the following areas: research and analysis, service provision, advocacy, law, policy, and Board governance;
- The Board is particularly interested in candidates who have experience in 1) political advocacy including engaging with political representatives in matters relating to immigration and/or citizenship, and 2) fundraising and resource development.
- A commitment to regularly attend and participate in discussions at Board Meetings at least six (6) times per year;
- A willingness to contribute an additional five hours a month to a committee or task group, or other Board-related volunteer work; and
- Ability to speak French, or other languages including Indigenous languages.

CCS encourages applications from individuals who are currently or formerly stateless or who have experienced statelessness in some way. CCS also encourages applications from those who may not have legal status in Canada. Please include a **cover letter** and **CV/resume** in your application package.

*Please note that CCS Management Board membership is prohibited for those who are employed in government or intergovernmental organisations engaged in immigration, citizenship, or enforcement related matters, excluding anyone who receives remuneration or funding from such governmental entity solely for the purpose of conducting project-based scholastic research.
